REGISTRATION PROGRAM UPDATE

The 2022 plant inspections are complete. My last inspection of the 22 registered tank producer plants. was in mid-December. Most producers talked about how busy 2022 was. Several reported a record year in tank sales. I was happy to see that the tanks produced, in all but a very few instances, are of very high quality. It is also good to see that all producers are now supplying the required safety device with each septic tank they sell.

Some producers were a bit frustrated about this new requirement. They saw it as another hoop to jump through that CSA has imposed. Yes, all registered producers must meet the requirements of CSA 866-21 in order to place a red tag on their tank. Aside from the safety device, there are many requirements in this specification and it's my job to ensure the tanks inspected meet all of those requirements.

A little digging will show why this new safety device has been implemented. I invite you to Google 'septic tank

accidents'. You will find numerous reports of people, pets and other animals falling into operating septic tanks. Most are simply an embarrassing event but there are instances where people have died. Many of those fatalities have been children. This is tragic and something had to be done to reduce the risk. This is not only an Ontario or Canadian problem. You can read stories of people falling in tanks in the US and throughout the world. I am pleased CSA has taken this risk seriously and implemented a solution.

It is important that all CPA registered tanks include this safety device. We do not want to read about any of our members in the news because of a tank mishap.

In 1975 Darrell decided to commit full time to the precast concrete business and started Miller Precast Ltd. (and later Lockstone Yard and Patio Centre among other business ventures). His wife, Joan, also left

her job to do the books for the new business. Darrell remained the president for 47 years until his passing, He cherished every day he spent working alongside his wife, son, and grandsons and took pride in knowing that his work would be carried on.
